Regulations for ASE Scholarships of Engineering College

- I. Purpose: The National Sun Yat-sen University (hereafter referred to as “the University”) has established the National Sun Yat-sen University College of Engineering ASE Scholarships (hereafter referred to as “the ASE Scholarships”) to foster professionals in the field of engineering and assist outstanding students in focusing on their studies.
- II. Eligibility: Second-, third-, and fourth-year undergraduate students; first- and second-year master’s students; and first-, second-, and third-year doctoral students in various engineering departments
- III. Number of Candidates and Scholarship Amounts
 - A. 36 Outstanding Performance Scholarships are granted each year.
 - 6 undergraduate and 3 master’s/doctoral students in the Department of Electrical Engineering
 - 6 undergraduate and 3 master’s/doctoral students in the Department of Mechanical Electromechanical Engineering
 - 3 undergraduate and 3 master’s/doctoral students in the Department of Computer Science and Engineering
 - 3 undergraduate and 2 master’s/doctoral students in the Department of Materials and Optoelectronic Science
 - 3 undergraduate and 2 master’s/doctoral students in the Department of Photonics
 - 1 master’s/doctoral student in the Institute of Environmental Engineering
 - 1 master’s/doctoral student in the Institute of Communications Engineering
 - B. ASE may irregularly increase the number of ASE scholarships.

- C. Following review and approval, scholarships are granted monthly for 12 months. An undergraduate student receives NT \$3,600 per month for a total of NT \$43,200. A master's/doctoral student receives NT \$5,000 per month for a total of NT \$60,000.

IV. Application Process:

Applicants must submit the following documents:

- A. Application form
- B. Autobiography (within one A4 page)
- C. Faculty member or supervisor's recommendation letter
- D. Past transcripts

Applications must be submitted to relevant departments prior to 30 September each year.

- V. Organization Operation: ASE Scholarships are periodically donated by the ASE to the University and the years of execution depend on donation budget. Scholarships are arranged once a year. Individual departments shall complete preliminary reviews and submit a recommendation priority list to the College of Engineering, where a decision is made in the College Advisory Meeting.
- VI. The present regulations shall be implemented following approvals of the College of Engineering Chairs Meeting and the ASE Group, as well as the authorization of the president. The same procedure shall be carried out when amendments are to be made.
